Footwashing:

Some people try to use Isaiah 1:14 to say that GOD hates the Holy Days. People take that verse completely out of context. GOD had created the Holy Days & commanded His People to observe them. The context of Isaiah 1 is that GOD was frustrated with the hypocritical sins of the people. It didn't do any good to keep the Holy Days if they were unrepented sinners. The people thought they were Holy because they kept the letter of the Law.

We do not keep the Holy Days & Sabbaths by the letter of the law, but rather with The Spirit of the law, that means by the principal of the law. The reason it was created. The days keep us in remembrance of historical events in the Kingdom, as well as teach us things about GOD's perfect Plan of Salvation as well as future events of The Kingdom.

The 4th of July reminds Americans of our nations history. It is a memorial. We don't need to be commanded to keep it. However, the Federal government does require all federal offices to be closed that day. It is a sabbath unto man. And a memorial. Everyone wants to remember the

importance of the meaning behind the 4th of July. It is important to the United States. The Feast Days of The LORD are important to the citizens of The Kingdom of GOD. They have great historical lessons & Honor our King & our Kingdom. They remind us of a time pass & a Future yet to come.

Feast Days, Part of the Handwriting of Ordinances???

We know from the Sabbath Bible Study that there are two laws. One is the law of Moses, also known as the old covenant which is done away with. The other is the Law of GOD including the 10 Commandments which are NOT done away with. The old covenant contract INCLUDED the 10 Commandments & the Feast Days of JESUS. But the Commandments & Feast Days also stand on their own, independent of the old covenant. It was wrong to steal & kill before, during AND after the old covenant. We are required to serve only ONE GOD before, during & after the old covenant. The Sabbath & Feast Days of JESUS existed before, during & after the old covenant; and are the memorial & celebration Days of our Kingdom AND have great symbolism of future prophetic events AND teach us about the true plan of salvation.

Once we understand about the pagan customs & traditions of mankind, & separate ourselves from such things as Halloween, Christmas, Easter, Valentines Day, Mothers day, etc. , are GOD's people left WITHOUT celebration or commemoration? NO! Every kingdom has its celebrations & days of observation. Easter is the counterfeit of Passover. Christmas is the counterfeit of the Fiesta of Dedication/Hanukkah. Let's not keep the counterfeit, but rather observe the real days of celebration & commemoration of The Kingdom of GOD.
